John Doe passed away on June 29, 2020, in Searcy, Arkansas. He was born to James and Jane Smith Doe on January 1, 1945, at Baptist Hospital in Little Rock, Arkansas. He graduated from Searcy High School with honors in 1963 and then attended the University of Arkansas where he was a pre-med major. After graduation, he entered the University of Arkansas Medical Sciences, and after four years there, he accepted a surgery residency at Baptist Memorial Healthcare System in Memphis, Tennessee. Following completion of his medical training, he entered the United States Army as a captain and trained at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, Texas. Following training, he was assigned to Fort Benning, Georgia, where he completed his military service at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Doe returned to Searcy and enjoyed a very satisfying medical career serving as a surgeon affiliated with Unity Health where he served as Chief of Staff. He also was instrumental in mentoring young surgeons that studied and practiced in the hospital. His professional organizations included the American Medical Association and the American College of Surgeons. He continued to support his college fraternity, Sigma Chi, as an involved alumnus and was a member of the American Legion. Doe was also an avid sportsman, who enjoyed golf, hunting, fishing, and coaching Little League baseball. A member of the First United Methodist Church, he was a Sunday School teacher, sang in the Chancel Choir, and served on numerous church committees. Predeceasing him were his parents and a brother, Joe Doe. His survivors include his wife of 45 years, Mary Jones Doe, his son, Dr. John Doe, Jr. and his wife, Sarah Miller Doe, and his daughter, Emily Doe Martin and her husband, Mark Martin and his grandchildren, Elizabeth Doe and John Martin. Visitation with the family will be on Thursday, July 2 at 1:00 p.m. in the First Methodist Church Welcome Center with the funeral service to follow at 2:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. The arrangements are under the direction of Powell Funeral Home. Interment will be in the White County Memorial Gardens. Reverend John Smith will officiate.
